Hint of go-slow on on-line retail rules

New Delhi,

The government is exploring the possibility of deferring the new FDI norms in e-commerce until Walmart has been given "significant customer disruption" if the norms are not delayed by six months.

The norms notified last month prohibit large online marketplaces such as Amazon and Flipkart from owning equity in any of their vendors or having control over the inventories sold on their platforms.

We have received representation for and against the implementation of the new policy from February 1. A consensus will have to be soon taken after taking all aspects into account, a senior commerce ministry official said.

Sources said the Modi government is in a difficult situation as these changes are being seen by global business leaders as policy uncertainty and impacting investment sentiments. However, with general elections round the corner, the government is likely to antagonize the trading community, a strong support base for the BJP, who had

been affected by demonetization and its backdoor entry of online retailers with deep pockets. However, sources said the government could postpone the norms by a couple of months to enable the global players to restructure their businesses.

The guidelines said e-commerce entities, which operate a marketplace, will not be allowed to exercise ownership or control over inventory. Any ownership or control over the inventory sold on their platforms.

The 83-year-old Congress veteran says the construct of Indian nationalism is constitutional patriotism, highlighting that several factors that complete it are "the ability to self correct and learn from others."

He states that when independent India made universal adult suffrage the basis of its political culture, it was convinced of its implementation.

"However, the successful manner which the very first elections were conducted put specific focus to it. Since then over the years, the EC has been conducting elections successfully and improving on deficiencies to increasing participation in elections," he says.

He also expresses his worry on the abuse of

money and muscle power to influence voters during the elections.

"The spirit of democracy will be subverted if these malpractices are not checked. We must demand that the Election Commission takes up initiatives to promote ethical and informed voting," notes Mukherjee.

Nissan abandons plans of X-Trail model in UK

London, Japanse carmaker Nissan confirmed it had abandoned plans to build the model X-Trail in Sunderland, North East England on Sunday.

According to a letter written by Nissan Europe chairman Gianluca de Ficchy to workers, the X-Trail will continue to be made in Japan.

Nissan said Brexit uncertainty had played a part in the decision, added that "We have taken this decision for the business reasons," we explained, but the letter did not give details. The company's relationship with the EU is not helping companies like ours to plan for the future." "With the UK's departure from the EU on March 29th getting closer every week, we have a taskforce in place, reporting to me, that it is considering all of the possible scenarios, including potential Brexit deal," he said, reports Xinhua.

He said the workforce in Sunderland will continue to benefit from the investment planned for Juke and Qashqai.

Nissan employs around 7,000 people in Sunderland. The X-Trail production plans had been announced in the autumn of 2016.
